PROFESSOR ROGER WILLIAMS, CBE

Liver disease is the only major cause of death in the UK still increasing year-on-year, with mortality rates rising faster than diabetes, cancer, heart disease, stroke and respiratory disease. Twice as many people now die from liver disease as in 1991. It is estimated that deaths from liver disease will double over the next 20 years.

RESEARCH MAKES THE DIFFERENCE

- ✓ Liver transplant survival for patients 5yrs post transplant is now at 70%
- ✓ Acute liver failure survival rates have increased from 30% to 60%
- ✓ Primary liver cancer survival with early diagnosis is now 50% at 5yrs
- ✓ Chronic hepatitis C can be cured in up to 80% of patients
- ✓ Hepatitis B can be controlled in 90% of patients

RESEARCH AT THE INSTITUTE OF HEPATOLOGY

Research in the Institute is organised around major research projects within the common overall theme of ***Liver Cell Injury and Repair***. Cell injury whether due to viral hepatitis, therapeutic drug hepatotoxicity, autoimmunity or the major lifestyle issues of alcohol consumption and obesity, involves common mechanisms of cell death. Similarly, when common processes of cell repair are dis-regulated, this forms the basis of progression to cirrhosis and hepatocellular carcinoma. Identification of the specific cellular pathways involved will allow development of new therapeutic agents for use in the early stages where complete recovery is an option, and in the more chronic phases for halting progression of liver damage.

A 'magic bullet' to treat liver cancer

Dr Marco Della Peruta has worked for the Foundation for 3yrs and together with colleagues at UCL he is developing a strategy to deliver therapeutic genes directly to the liver. One of the most remarkable features of the liver is its ability to self-repair by producing replacement liver cells, or hepatocytes. In patients with hepatocellular carcinoma, the liver's ability to produce these healthy hepatocytes becomes impaired and cancerous cells begin to proliferate. Marco's strategy is to introduce a therapeutic gene which will travel directly to the liver and target and destroy cancer cells. This 'magic bullet' will be carried to the liver by a viral vector and will be administered to the patient through a single injection. Marco's work is now at the stage where pre-clinical models have shown very promising results and the aim is to move into trials with patients within the next 12 months.
